Romans was written approximately seven years after the events in Acts 18. What does that tell you about the combined ministry of Aquila and Priscilla?

[Read: 1 Corinthians 16:19](#)

Do you think it is extraordinary that they hosted a church in their home?

In what ways can you use the home you share together to serve others?
