Application-Life Principles

- 1. Problems are likely a setup for something good (vs. 2)
- 2. Those who should help often don't (vs. 6-8)
- 3. God usually works through prayer (vs. 9-11) (Phil 4:6-7)
- 4. Expect to be misunderstood (vs. 12-14)
- 5. People best serve by pointing others to God (vs. 17)
- 6. In the end God rewards those who trust Him (vs. 19-20)
- 7. Your challenges connect to something bigger than you
