Peter's sermon: "Peter seized the opportunity to preach. Just as the Pentecost event had been the text for his first sermon, so the cripple's healing became the text for his second. Both were mighty acts of the exalted Christ. Both were signs which proclaimed him Lord and Savior. Both aroused the crowd's amazement.

Peter began by ascribing all the credit to Jesus. 'Men of Israel, why does this surprise you?' he asked (12), presumably pointing to the healed cripple. And 'Why do you stare at us, presumably making a gesture which pointed to themselves, as if it had been by our own power or godliness that we had made this man walk?' (12). Instead, he redirected their gaze to Jesus, by whose powerful name the miracle had taken place. For 'The God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our fathers, had glorified his servant Jesus' (13a). – John Stott
