Application

• When wrongly accused, Jesus did not respond verbally. There are times to speak, but there are also times to remain quiet. Learn to discern when it is time to remain silent

• Read Phil. 2:1-11; Matt. 11:29; Luke 6:27-36; Heb. 12:3; 1 Pet. 3:9. How does seeing the example of Jesus stir praise for His goodness, righteousness, strength in humility, and patience in your heart? What do you need to model during this season from His life? Ask the Spirit to make you like Jesus.
